This Old Iron By Bob Smith

Gary Provansal's 1926 15hp Fairbanks-Morse. If this engine sounds familiar, well it is the same year and horsepower as the club engine. Gary left the original patina which makes it look quite good with the rustic setup he created for it. Gary purchased the engine which was mounted on railroad ties, from a gentleman in Hesperia. It was pretty much restored so with a little work on the carburetor and water pump and changing the muffler with a

straight pipe, Gary has the engine running great. If you stand next to it and close your eyes, you would swear you are standing next to the club engine. With the straight pipe exhaust, both engines sound the same.

The history Gary was told by the previous owner was the engine was originally used in Burbank to irrigate the groves. It ended up in Rialto as yard art and was rescued and restored by the owner in Hesperia that Gary bought it from.

I hope Gary brings it out to some shows in 2017 because it is quite a setup to see.
