The WAPA members present were Ron Haskell showing his 5 hp Frisco Standard marine engine. He also brought the pedal power water pump that was enjoyed by the public. Arriving with Ron was Merle Morse showing an International Model LB 1½ hp fully enclosed engine belted to a post drill press. Merle also had a 2 hp Associated that was water cooled. And then we had Ken and Larry Evans with their 1¾ hp air cooled United belted to the mystery Duro pump. The mystery is that the catch bucket never fills or empties, it just stays at one level, except for splashing out a bit. What is disappointing is that we only used up half of the space allotted to us. Next year I would like to see more participation from the members. Although we only had four engines, we were able to stretch it out and the sponsors were very happy with the display.

Hay Rides at LA County Fair 2018 By Bob Smith

Cal Poly was asked to give hay rides at the fair on Saturdays and Sundays. WAPA was asked to drive the tractor. We both accepted so we started to prep the wagon and 2 tractors to take to the fairgrounds.

We chose the restored and painted 1948 John Deere A and 1953 John Deere 50. We filled them with water, gas and oil, and greased all the zerk fittings. With a pilot car leading and following we drove



both tractors with wagons from the tractor shop on south campus of Cal Poly to the fairgrounds. All went well with no issues. On the first day of the fair the rides went well with attendance kind of low. Towards the end of the day the tractor acted like the carburetor needed adjusting but adjusting didn't seem to help. I contacted Ron and he said he had a spare carburetor so I picked it up early Sunday morning and went to the fairgrounds to install it. Lance and Tim showed up to drive that day and the A seemed to be running a little better. During the day it started to act up and died. They pushed it aside and brought out the JD 50. It ran great but the water pump was leaking so badly that they had to put 2 gallons of water in after each trip.

The following Wednesday Ron and Jim checked out the A and discovered the rotor has a broken spring clip and was flopping around and grinding into the contacts on the cap. We put the tractor on Ron's trailer and took it back to Cal Poly. Friday morning Leroy and I went to the tractor shop and prepped another 1951 John Deere A and drove it to the fairgrounds. That tractor did fine for the Saturday and Sunday hay rides. Magneto parts are on order for the A and a water pump is on order for the 50. Two more projects to add to our growing list of things to work on this winter.
