**Riverside Air Show, Saturday, March 24

We have again been invited to participate in the Riverside Air Show on Saturday, March 24. The last times we were there were outstanding. Setup starts at 7:00 a.m. Please bring your own water and shade. There are food vendors on the premises or you can bring your own lunch.

Most of you will probably come on Hwy 60, take the Van Buren Exit and turn right, make a left on Arlington Avenue, go about 2 blocks and turn left on Monroe/ Airport Drive.

Alternately, from the 91, exit at Adams Street and turn north, then left on Arlington. Proceed to Airport Drive.

Enter the airport at the Monroe Street/Airport Drive entrance (main entrance) off of Arlington Avenue. Follow the road around the parking lot on your left until you reach the gate into the Commemorative Air Force hangar. Turn right and continue out to the north/south runway. We will be on the west side of the dirt area this year.

**Team Tractor MM

Ron Haskell, Dave Stockton, Lance Wilson, Paul Liverman, and I went out to Gil Stewarts house to prepare the Minneapolis-Moline for transport. Ron brought a forklift on a tilt bed trailer to assist with the heavy lifting. We started with the engine block. Ron picked it up with a couple of straps and positioned it to the rear-end. Dave turned the crank shaft with a hand crank while Lance rocked it into place. The bolts were installed and tightened to secure the two units together. Next there were 2 plates that bolted to the side of the block and extended to the front to secure the radiator housing. All were bolted and secured. The front axle was secured to the bottom of the radiator housing with a single pin. Now it was time to mount the wheels to the front axle first and then the rear wheels to the rear hubs. It only took 2 ½ hours to assemble and get ready to winch onto Paul's trailer for transport to Cal Poly.

All the remaining pieces were loaded into the back of my truck. The tractor is stored under a roof at Cal Poly along with the remaining parts. We will slowly begin to reassemble the tractor and give it a shiny paint job. We will keep you updated.

Proposed Bylaws Change By Bob Smith

At the last board meeting I mentioned a change that long standing member Jim Davis would like to make regarding the bereavement tribute to fallen WAPA members. The change would require a modification to the bylaws. I wrote the change and would like all members to review it before the board votes on the bylaw change at the March meeting. If you have any comments or concerns then please attend the next board meeting and voice those concerns. Remember, silence is acceptance.

The change would be to ARTICLE IX. EXPENSE POLICY, Section One, paragraph 5.

Floral or bereavement tribute for serious illness or death of member or family member within the first degree of relationship: **By order of the Membership Director, a bequeath will be transferred to a special account to cover the cost of a memorial brick or stone in the name of a member who has recently passed away. This brick or stone will be engraved with the member's name. The brick or stone will be placed in the WAPA museum memorial garden or walkway to honor those members.** The limit set for this tribute is \$100 which amount may be changed from time to time by a resolution of the Board of Directors with no other authority than this Bylaw.
