Museum: Craig Maxwell distributed maps of the old Guasti vineyard property which is County owned and directly north of Cucamonga-Guasti Regional Park at the S/E corner of Archibald Ave. and Fourth St. in the city of Ontario. The County of San Bernardino is considering the property as a location for WAPA to establish a museum operation. The property has a house and vineyard buildings which have been vandalized. There are approximately 10 to 12 acres of land involved. The majority of the meeting time was spent in discussing the museum issue. After all attendees had discussed the issue at length, on a motion by Millett and seconded by Siddons, Museum Director Craig Maxwell will attempt to gain approval from the County to permit all WAPA members to tour the site on a given day.
