Roger has an awesome house, two stories and full of wood paneling and river rock. There is a lovely grand entrance,

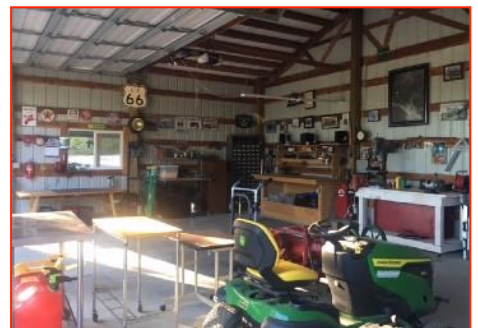
