CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Smith at 9:00 am.

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS REMARKS/REPORTS

PRESIDENT: Bob Smith mentioned the loss of Gordon Morse and Merle Morse. Bob also discussed the ballots for next year's Board of Directors, thanked Dave Pasillas for rebuilding the John Deere display frame and discussed the four tractors purchased for Cal Poly. **VICE PRESIDENT:** Dave Foley thanked volunteers at the Pumpkin Fest and Bob for his 6 days/week commitment.

SECRETARY: Eric Waltzer made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 7, Board of Directors meeting. Motion seconded by Dave Foley. Eric also thanked all who helped at the engine display.

TREASURER: Kelley Garcia absent. Bob presented the October 2024 financial report. As of October 31, 2024: checking account balance – \$1,654.05; savings account balance – \$30,749.01; WAPA museum account balance – \$166,295.92.

MEMBERSHIP: Lorelei Rimpau: Total membership – 113. Active dues paying members – 77; Life members – 31; Honorary members – 4; Complimentary members – 1. Lorelei made a motion to accept Matt Draayom as a new member. Motioned seconded by Dave Foley. Discussion was held on increasing membership dues to the following:

Lorelei made a motion to change the membership dues. Motion seconded by Eric Waltzer.

SHOWS: Mitchell Reichwein: At the Irwindale Speedway Cal-Rods Car Show everyone had a good time with the display area located at the starting line. There was good attendance at both the Cal Poly Pumpkin Fest and Glendora pumpkin festival. <u>Upcoming Events:</u>

Display area on the flight line. -48thDAA (District Agricultural Associations) Fall in the Farm, LA Fairplex - November 23. Enter at gate 12 with setup time 7 am - 8:45 am. This is a paid show for WAPA and your attendance would be appreciated.

-Calico Ghost Town has asked WAPA to attend. Show planned for Feb 2025. Ten camp sites will be made available to WAPA members. -A WAPA swap meet is planned for January 2025. Larry Madole to coordinate.

MUSEUM: Ron Haskell: Minimal work efforts were performed on the building due to volunteers helping with the Pumpkin Fest. The petting zoo hand washing station has worked out very well. Operational review of the new hay wagon showed that the handicap ramp was utilized with no problems and issues were found with steering bar ties elongating due to loosening of the lock nuts. The wagon bed needs to be raised due to tires bumping the frame underside. John DeLazzaro has completed installation of the air distribution lines and air hose reels. John continues to sort nuts and bolts. Dick Bouma is continuing efforts to sort through library material. The Western 160 cast iron parts have been returned and dimensions for the concrete base have been sized. The area in front of the building to the end of gravel drive needs to be leveled and additional gravel applied before the raining season begins. Kim Reyes, the new Citrus Park director met with Ron to become aquatinted with past work done on the Western 200 and its current status.

NEW BUSINESS: Discussion was held on changing the by-laws to remove the requirement to set aside in a fund, twenty five percent, (25%), of all gross proceeds for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a Corporate Museum. With our current occupation of the Cal Poly building serving as our museum and the constant transfer of funds into the museum fund and then back into our checking account to reimburse members for the purchase of items used in the building or on equipment or to pay outside contractors for work performed on or around the building or equipment repair, it was felt that at this time we can forgo the need to set aside the twenty five percent of gross proceeds. Lance Wilson is creating memorial pictures of past members. These pictures will be hung on the outside wall of the kitchen area. Dave Ruhland requested a moment of silence for both Gordon Morse and Merle Morse. At the conclusion of the meeting Bob Smith will pass out ballots for voting the 2025 Board of Directors.
