

This Old Iron—Dick Bouma by Dave Ruhland

I was born August 28, 1941, in Bellflower, California, the first child to Lawrence and Geneva Bouma. Following me was a brother and five sisters so you can imagine what our home life was like; it was great. When I was born, my father was a dairyman in Downey, California. We moved to Chino Valley when I was about 2 yrs old. My first recollections are of living on dairies in Chino Valley. My introduction to gas engines was on a dairy. The valley at that time was mostly dairies the only needed electricity to run the vacuum pump for the milking machines and lighting. Quite often the power would go out due to wind, so the milking machines would quit, cows don't like that. Milking can't stop in the middle of the process. In the machine room my Dad had a vacuum pump, on one side was a 3 hp electric motor and on the other side a 3 hp Fairbanks Z. My Dad gave me this information later on in life, but I remember as a 4 or 5 year old boy standing there watching that old Fairbanks run. Later on remembering it, I always wanted to find one. As time went on, I graduated from high school and went to work in my Dad's manufacturing plant making milking machines. Not a job I enjoyed so I went to trade school on the GI Bill to learn air conditioning-my profession for over 40 years when I retired.

I met my wife, Maureen, in 1972 on a blind date. We dated for three years and got married in 1975. She had two great kids and while we were dating, Eric, her son, had a Lionel train set. Maureen, asked me one day to get it running and through that I found train collectors in the area and met Kenny Byers. Kenny had been collecting gas engines and when I saw them, my memories of the engine on the dairy came back and we became good friends. I purchased a Stover engine from him which was the start of my engine collection. Maureen likes to remind people that on our honeymoon, I was able to contact a fellow in San Luis Obispo that had engines. I purchased a Cushman Cub for the magneto that was on it. I had to take the suitcases out of the trunk, put them in the back seat and we were able to load the Cushman into the trunk of my Chevy and she hasn't let me forget that.

Kenny called me one day that he had met a fellow who belonged to a group of engine collectors that had formed a club and wanted us to join. This was in the spring of 1978. Both of us joined and I remember going to the first meeting in a park near where Bill Baldwin lived. Bill Brinkley was the president and Kenny and I had a great morning. We were, I think, 23rd & 24th members to join the club. It has been a great hobby and I have gotten to meet really wonderful people all over the country and even in New Zealand and Australia. I have become friends with many collectors.

I am really enjoying our new home at Cal Poly and especially our Tuesday work days. It has been a lot of years coming. Thanks to the work and foresight of many of the members some whom are unfortunately no longer with us. I could name names, but it would fill another page.
