I was born in Minnesota and lived on a 160 acre farm joining 3 older sisters and one brother (the oldest sister died young). When I was 5, we moved to my grandfather's farm of 320 acres and my father wondered how he could farm that much land, but we did. Us kids had to help out and by the time I was 7, I was driving a tractor for simple jobs like picking up rocks in the field and feeding the milk cows, pigs, chickens, and sheep. After school there were always chores to do and we did what we could to help. It was a good life and I'm glad that I had that opportunity, although I didn't think so at the time. I got to learn a bit of blacksmithing and welding and other necessary skills for later in life. I was just over 13 years old when we moved to Arizona and by this time I had 3 more younger brothers and a younger sister. My oldest sister and brother staved in Minnesota as they were married and had lives to live there. I didn't like Arizona as it was too hot for me, although I did get odd jobs and did well in school, graduating in June, 1966. I left Arizona that same night for California. I had spent the summer of '65 in California working with an older sister in a silk-screening job getting \$1.15/hour. Arizona only paid \$0.75/hour so you can see the incentive. I did warehouse work for W.T. Grant Co. and Alpha Beta Grocery. I spent '68-'69 in Minnesota working for my older brother plumbing, returning to California just before the moon landing. I got into the electrical trade in late '69, became an apprentice in '70, and retired as a high voltage cable splicer in 2010. I'm sure glad I got my career done back when I had time to do it.

I joined WAPA in 1986 and have had many good friends and good times; and I really enjoy our work parties that we have at Cal Poly. I am a member of Vista having joined there at about the same time. I spent 25 years at Vista signing up people for the parade taking over that job from Bill Baldwin when he couldn't do it.

I have been a member of California Nomads for over 52 years and been president for 30+ years off and on. I got into square dancing in '74 and that's where I met my loving wife, Margaret. We celebrated our 43rd anniversary this February. I have a couple of engines that I enjoy but tractors are what I really like, having a bunch of them. I also enjoy being able to help anyone with one of their projects. Besides my wife, my greatest treasure is all the friends I have made.

CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Smith at 9:00 am.

FLAG SALUTE: Led by Bob Smith.

WELCOME: President Bob Smith welcomed members and reminded them that they may speak on any subject brought before the board.

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS REMARKS/REPORTS

PRESIDENT: Bob Smith discussed the inability to administer Jim Treadwell's oath of office due to his absence, museum changes to date, and disbanding the Western 160 move committee.

VICE PRESIDENT: Dave Foley thanked the membership for their help at the museum and the Cal Poly school field trip tractor drives.

SECRETARY: Eric Waltzer made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 2, board meeting. Motion seconded by Dave Foley.

TREASURER: Kelley Garcia presented the March 2024 financial report. As of March 31, 2024: checking account balance – \$3,294.45; savings account balance – \$34,427.37; WAPA museum account balance – \$172,260.27. The club asset report will be presented at the May meeting. Kelley delivered the discounted postage stamps.

MEMBERSHIP: Lorelei Rimpau: Total membership – 119. Active dues paying members – 82; Life members – 32; Honorary members – 4; Complimentary members – 1. Lorelei made a motion to accept Steve Mello as a WAPA member, Kelley Garcia seconded the motion.

PURCHASING: Open Position

SAFETY: Jim Treadwell was absent. Jim was on site at the La Verne Cool Cruise and identified several safety issues. The issues will be identified at a future meeting.
