CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Smith at 9:01 am.

FLAG SALUTE: Led by Lance Wilson.

WELCOME: President Bob Smith welcomed members and reminded them that they may speak on any subject brought before the board.

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS REMARKS/REPORTS

PRESIDENT: Bob Smith described his trip to Missouri to visit his sister. He brought back his friend's International LB engine for repair. **VICE PRESIDENT:** Dave Foley described his camping trip to Morro Bay. No updates on Gordon Morse who has been admitted to Riverside Community Hospital.

SECRETARY: Eric Waltzer made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 6, board of directors meeting. Motion seconded by Mitchell Reichwein.

TREASURER: Kelley Garcia presented the July 2024 financial report. As of June 30, 2024: checking account balance – \$6,359.51; savings account balance – \$30,257.28; WAPA museum account balance – \$166,712.18.

MEMBERSHIP: Lorelei Rimpau: Total membership – 114. Active dues paying members – 78; Life members – 31; Honorary members – 4; Complimentary members – 1. Joe Siddons received a recruiter pin for his effort in recruiting Brian Leach.

PURCHASING: Open Position: WAPA hats, shirts, and coffee mugs with the WAPA logo are available for sale. Customized mugs are also available.

SAFETY: Dave Ruhland talked about the fire that occurred on the Minneapolis Moline. A cracked plastic fuel filter allowed fuel to spill onto the starter and the ground. When the engine was started, the fuel was ignited resulting in a fire on the tractor and on the ground. The fire was quickly extinguished with no damage to the tractor. Ron Haskell brought up a safety item concerning unhitching a trailer: always keep the safety chains attached to the towing vehicle as the trailer hitch is being disengaged. The chains will restrain the trailer in case of any uncontrollable trailer movement. There was a known fatal injury due to the trailer shifting while being unhitched.

SHOWS: Mitchell Reichwein: Upcoming shows include: Irwindale Speedway Cal-Rods car show - September 22. Nine WAPA members have signed up and will get an admission ticket. One ticket is remaining.

Cal Poly Pumpkin Fest- September 28 to October 27.

Glendora Pumpkin Festival - October 19, sanctioned, seconded by Ron Haskell.

Flabob Airport Veterans Day Celebration - November 9 (sanctioned).

MUSEUM: Ron Haskell: Tuesday work day attendance has been low most likely due to the extremely hot days. Contractors have been bringing in fill dirt which has been leveled. Work on the new hay ride wagon is progressing with welding of the frame and sourcing of wheels and tires. Welding of Western 160 cast iron parts is nearing completion. Replacement governor parts are being 3D scanned. From the scanned information, casting patterns can be created. Mitch has installed a new voltage regulator on the John Deere 50. Sorting of nuts and bolts is ongoing, the battery recharging stand has been moved to the front of the building, the John Deere 1–1/2 and the Stover engines are operational. Work is continuing on the Hercules. Bob Holman has epoxy painted the kitchen floor and installed base boards. This completes the kitchen project. Portable bathroom is operational. Aerators in the faucets will need to have the calcium buildup removed. Base material for the 8 ft by 8 ft handwash station platform has been cut. Forklift pockets will allow for easy transportation.

MEMBERSHIP DISCUSSION: Merle Morse talked about his trip to Hearst Castle and met someone who lived in Rubel Castle and another person who attended North High School. Jim Davis commented on the excellent quality of the Hit & Miss newsletter and introduced his grandson who is from Texas and is a WAPA member. Dave Ruhland introduced his New Zealand friend Paul Daglish. Bob Holman asked about who can recharge a Wilco magnet. Ron Haskell responded that he has the equipment for recharging magnets.

EDITOR: Carol Haskell, Ellen Morse: Deadline for articles August 20th.

CAL POLY: Bob Smith: The Cal Poly Pumpkin Fest has been scheduled for September 28 to October 27. This is a major fundraiser for AGRIscapes which in turn helps WAPA through a monetary donation (\$6,000 last year) and use of the museum building and associated land space. All day tractor drivers will get a free Tee shirt and lunch voucher. All day engine display participants will receive a lunch voucher. We will need 3 tractor drivers to support hay wagon rides and 2 drivers to support cow train rides for the following days: Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm. In addition, drivers will be needed to support two cow trains for school field trips on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8:30 am to 2:00 pm. At least 2 members to support the WAPA engine display by answering questions, maintaining engine operation, and passing out club information for the following days: Saturdays and Sundays from 8:30 am to 6:00 pm.

Eric will coordinate the engine display and duck race. This year the duck races, cow train and engine display will be located next to each other. A fourth (18 ft long x 7 foot wide) hay wagon with improved handicap access is under construction.

COMMITTEE REPORT: Lance Wilson, chair of the 2025 directors nominating committee, presented which existing board members have volunteered to remain for another term: President - Open Position; Vice President - Dave Foley; Secretary - Eric Waltzer; Treasurer - Kelley Garcia; Show director - Mitchell Reichwein; Membership - Lorelei Rimpau; Museum Director - Ron Haskell; Safety - Open position. If there are any members who wish to run for any of these positions, please inform Lance Wilson.

Don Young is not doing very well. Lance called Sue Bradley. Both Sue and Phil are doing well with Sue transitioning from a walker to a cane.
