**WELCOME:** President Bob Smith welcomed members and reminded them that they may speak on any subject brought before the board.

#### **OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS REMARKS/REPORTS**

**PRESIDENT:** Bob Smith mentioned that Dave Ruhland and he went over to Greg Young's and picked up items for the Day On the Farm swap meet. Greg also donated \$300 to WAPA. A show fee of \$7500 was received from Cal Poly for WAPA's Pumpkin Festival participation.

VICE PRESIDENT: Dave Foley thanked everyone for their help in supporting WAPA.

**SECRETARY:** Dave Ruhland brought up an error in November's meeting minutes in that the spelling of Gordon Morris last name is not Morse. Eric Waltzer made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 2, Board of Directors meeting with the correct spelling of Gordon Morris last name. Motion seconded by Kelley Garcia.

**TREASURER:** Kelley Garcia presented the November 2024 financial report. As of November 30, 2024: checking account balance – \$5,907.04; savings account balance – \$31,674.03; WAPA museum account balance – \$171,359.37.

**MEMBERSHIP:** Lorelei Rimpau: Total membership – 114. Active dues paying members – 79; Life members – 31; Honorary members – 4; Complimentary members – 1. Fifty-year pins will be issued when you pay your 2025 dues. Dues for those who desire a hard copy of the Hit & Miss newsletter will be \$40. Lorelei made a motion to accept the following new members: Tim Mast, motion seconded by Ron Haskell; Kenneth Thomas, motion seconded by Kelley Garcia; and Ian Glover, motion seconded by Dave Foley. In order to update missing membership records, Lorelei made a request to be able to contact members to find out when they joined WAPA. Lorelei was authorized to contact affected members.

PURCHASING: Open Position: WAPA apparel and coffee mugs for sale.

**SAFETY:** Jim Treadwell absent.

**SHOWS:** Mitchell Reichwein absent. Bob Smith reported that the 48th DAA Fall in the Farm at the LA Fairplex was a very nice show with good attendance. There was slight confusion on the setup location but everything worked out. WAPA was paid \$250 for our participation. **Calico Ghost Town show** is planned for February 2025. Ten camp sites will be made available to WAPA members. **Highland Citrus Harvest Festival** is planned for March 29, 2025.

**MUSEUM:** Ron Haskell: The area from the front of the building to existing gravel drive has been leveled and graveled. This will help in directing rain water away from the building. Work parties have accomplished installation of the Minneapolis-Moline radiator by Mitchell and Steve, tractors purchased at the auction have been worked on and started up, fabrication of a 4 ft  $\times$  10 ft  $\times$  1 inch thick welding table has been started, and John continues sorting our fastener stock. The frame on the new red wagon needs to be raised 2 inches to keep the tires from hitting the frame when they are turned sharply and Larry Madole will be installing a new tarp shelter on the front of the building. The Western 160 foundation plan is being finalized with a final location to be sited in a couple of weeks. It is planned to rotate the engine 180 degrees and move it towards the east. The foundation will be performed in two pours with an estimated completion in a couple of months. All broken parts have been repaired and awaiting machining of the intake valve seat.
